Cricket Without Boundaries (CWB)

CWB is a UK charity incorporated as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, whose mission is to use cricket as a tool to help overcome social development issues. Currently it does this primarily through raising awareness of HIV / Aids Awareness in sub Saharan Africa. However more recently CWB has worked with other issues more relevant in the areas it is operating such as FGM, Female Empowerment and Child Soldier integration.

Established in 2005, CWB has had considerable impact since it was formed. We have coached over 150,000 children in eight African countries through our volunteers and over 80,000 through our ambassadors. We have also trained up nearly 3,000 coaches. We have recently started working with the Lancashire Cricket Club foundation to deliver gender equality training in England.

We are mainly run by a team of dedicated volunteers and operate under a clear set of values which set out how everything we do should be:

Person Specification

Outstanding individuals are sought who have a strong empathy with our mission to use cricket as a tool for social development and can 'live' the charity's values.

We seek individuals who can bring high level experience, success and skills in either sport for development or corporate partnerships and fundraising. In addition, experience in the following areas is also desired:

- Social Development / Community engagement (particularly in low and middle income countries)
- Charitable work
- Monitoring and Evaluation
- Recruitment / Volunteer management

The Board of Trustees is responsible for the overall governance and strategic direction of the charity, its financial health, the probity of its activities and developing the organisation's aims, objectives and goals in accordance with the governing document, legal and regulatory guidelines.

Experience:

- High level experience in either sport for development or corporate partnerships and fundraising
- Demonstrable experience of building and sustaining relationships with key stakeholders and colleagues to achieve organisational objectives
- A record of sound judgement and effective decision making
- A history of impartiality, fairness and the ability to respect confidences
- A track record of commitment to promoting equality and diversity

- An ability to work effectively as a member of a team
- An understanding of the respective roles of the Chair, Trustees and Operational team.

Trustee Role Description

The role of a Trustee is to ensure that CWB fulfils its duty to its beneficiaries through working in communities to support development through cricket and delivers on our vision, mission and values, as well as setting the direction and strategy of the charity.

The key duties of a trustee are:

- To ensure CWB complies with its constitution
- To ensure CWB pursues its objectives as defined in the constitution
- To ensure CWB applies its resources exclusively in pursuance of its objectives
- To contribute actively to the Board of Trustees' role in giving firm strategic direction to the charity
- To safeguard the good name and values of CWB

- To ensure the effective and efficient administration of CWB
- To ensure the financial stability of CWB

In addition, Trustees are expected to make full use of their specific skills, knowledge and experience to help the board make good decisions.

The above list of duties is indicative only and not exhaustive. The Trustee will be expected to perform all such additional duties as are reasonably commensurate with the role.
