2024 HIGHLIGHTS - MATHIAS WASIKE

Positive year all round...

8 schools visited (primary schools and junior secondary school) ... namely Mihang'o/ Huhoini/ Makuyu/ Ndera/ Murang'a College/ Punda Milia/ Kabati Central/ Kuguini. Coach education for an introduction course conducted by Cricket Kenya ...16 teachers attended equal number of male and female respectively.

I Mathias Wasike (Coach) have trained to do testing of HIV/AIDS, awareness of the same and counselling. I am graduating on Friday, 6th December 2024. Since Cricket Without Boundaries were a step forward in educating teams on HIV/AIDS, I took the initiative to also learn the same so that I can be in a position to council my prayers in case a case arises.

On Sunday, 1st December 2024, we celebrated World Aids Day by having a cricket game where we also did HIV/AIDS tests. For the first time since I started, we got six healthcare partners who came on board to assist in doing free tests on the ground level; namely Liverpool VCT, Equity Afya Bora, Aga Khan, NACADA, National Aids Council & Murang'a County Government.

It has been a great year so far and we are grateful and appreciate CWB and MCCF for the great support.

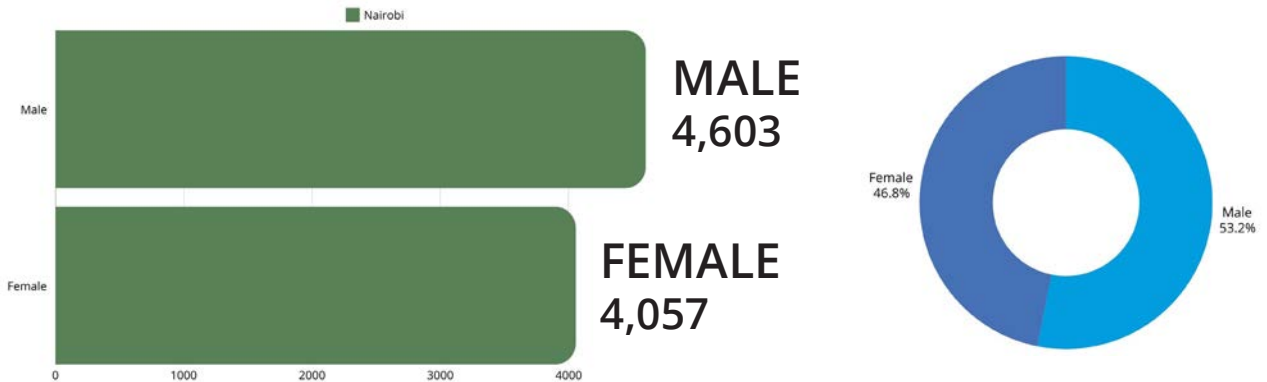

2024 HIGHLIGHTS - NICHOLAS OLOUCH

We participated in inter hub competitions which saw a different breed of players participating in the competitions while the seasoned players took part in the inaugural Nairobi based 30 over hard ball cricket league.

Our girls formed the bulk of players chosen to represent Kenya in the under 19 girls qualifier in Rwanda....out 16 players chosen from our side in the provisional squad 8 made it on the main team while a further 3 have been handed their debuts to senior team in the just concluded bilateral series against Rwanda both home and away.

We are currently participating in the Newly launched NAKURU t20 league and the results so far have shown the efforts the players have been doing over the years.

We are also taking part as a team in the ongoing Nairobi u19 red ball 40 cricket league... Our girls have participated in the Nairobi based under 19 girls league and have got another opportunity to play in a broad based league women's t20 league together with girls from Nakuru and Muranga.

Our main focus is to produce talent that is equally competitive in the league and offer opportunities of equal participation and selection in the national age group teams.

Ensuring that education takes the centre stage taking the players through basic education and making sure they graduate at least in secondary schools.

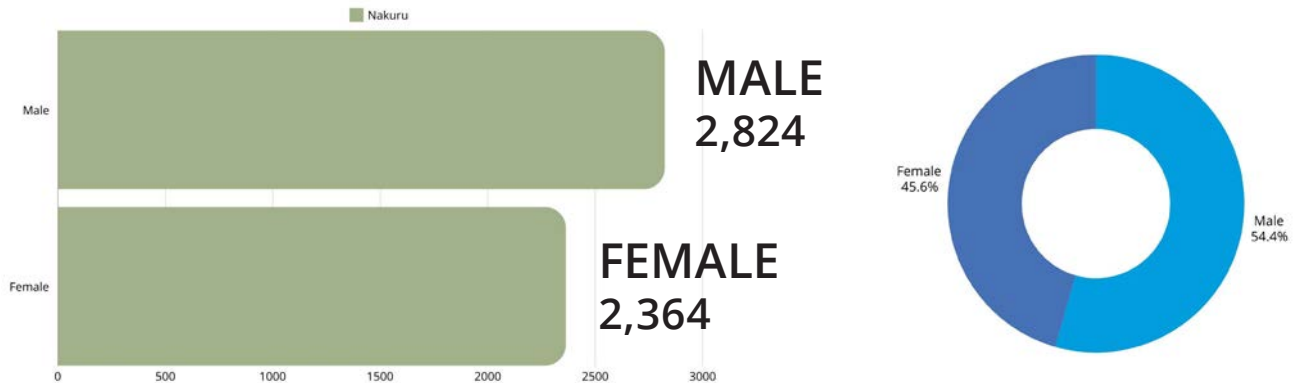

Improved performance all round. Skill development wise, the kids showcased notable advancement in technical skills, especially in bowling and fielding skills when playing at the Nakuru T20 League. An emphasis on fitness and discipline resulted in enhanced on field performance.

Player growth and recognition especially the emerging talents. We are proud of the girls selected for the under 19 Kenya Women's Team, notably Mario Jacinta who represented Kenya at the ICC U19 WOMEN'S T20 WORLD CUP AFRICA DIVISON 2 QUALIFIER and also ICC U19 WOMEN'S T20 WORLD CUP AFRICA QUALIFIER. A few kids have also emerged as strong leaders, contributing to a cohesive team environment. They offer guidance to the other kids during training and game days for the junior team (Pirates B)

The commencement of the T20 Nakuru Cricket League which had been dormant for the last six years. This has been a significant milestone for Nakuru Cricket as a whole, both the senior players and the kids shall benefit immensely. The kids now get to showcase their skills earned from the coaching sessions and community training and experience high pressure games.

The CWB tour to Nakuru is always a positive. Having them around is a major boost for moral for the kids. It's always a pleasure to host them and coach alongside them, they bring on board creative practice drills that kept the kids engaged and motivated.

With Honnette Irakoze from Nyamata lifting the award for the best under 15 wicket keeper across in Rwanda.





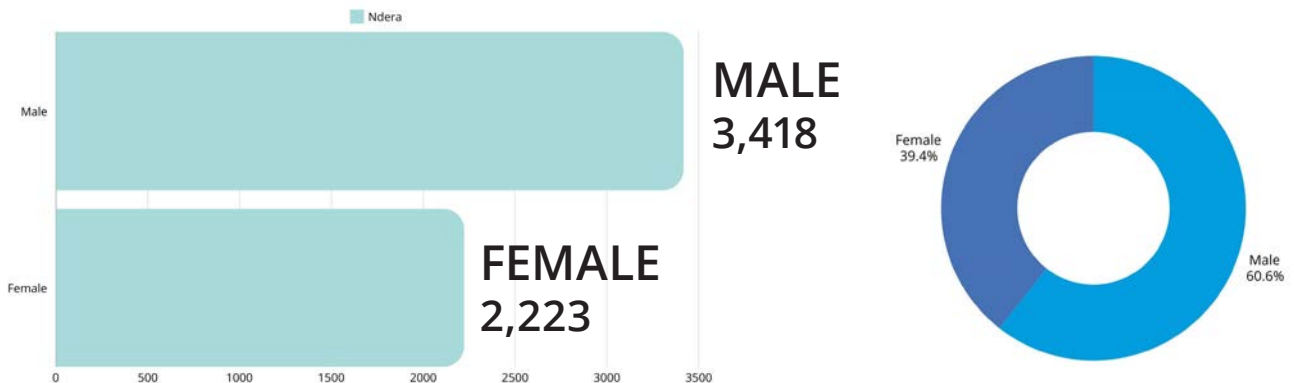

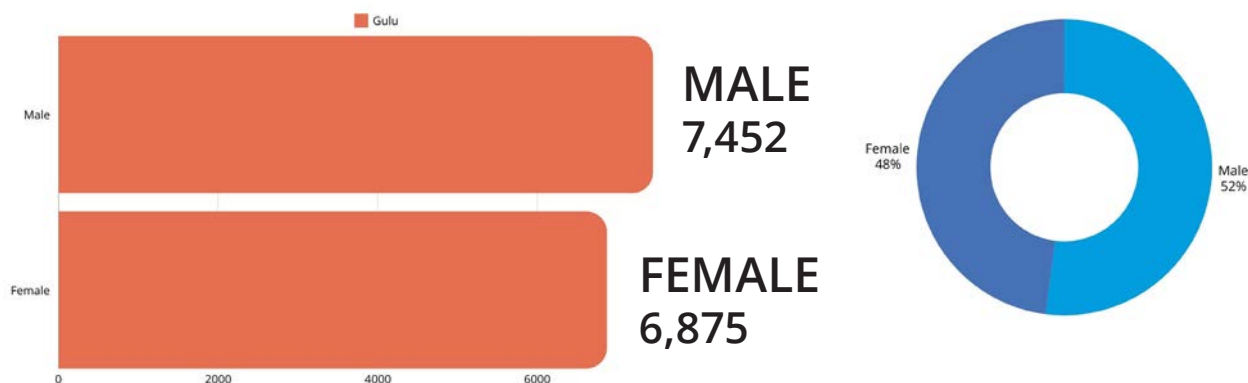

LEVELING THE PLAYING FIELD FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS.

As the year's theme was Championing Girls' cricket, there has been more engagement of the girls through programs like Inter Hub invitational tournament, girls residential cricket training camp and also festivals. Girls' cricket has had lots of challenges but we are slowly putting up a fight to see that all goes well. On the bid to engage more girls we have embarked on engaging more female coaches in the nearby future and the most recent scenario being Coach Sandra who has been deployed in Lira.

Good to see cricket moving from one level to another in the hub. As the hub is growing, we extended our cricket activities to new districts like Nebbi and Kitgum on addition to Lira, Masindi, Gulu and Arua to further discover more talent.

Lots of sessions in those different sub hubs have been conducted to enable promotion of the game and also improve on players' skills.

We have had many schools getting engaged in the game across the region both primary and secondary school to help grow grassroots cricket. (21 secondary schools and 56 primary schools).

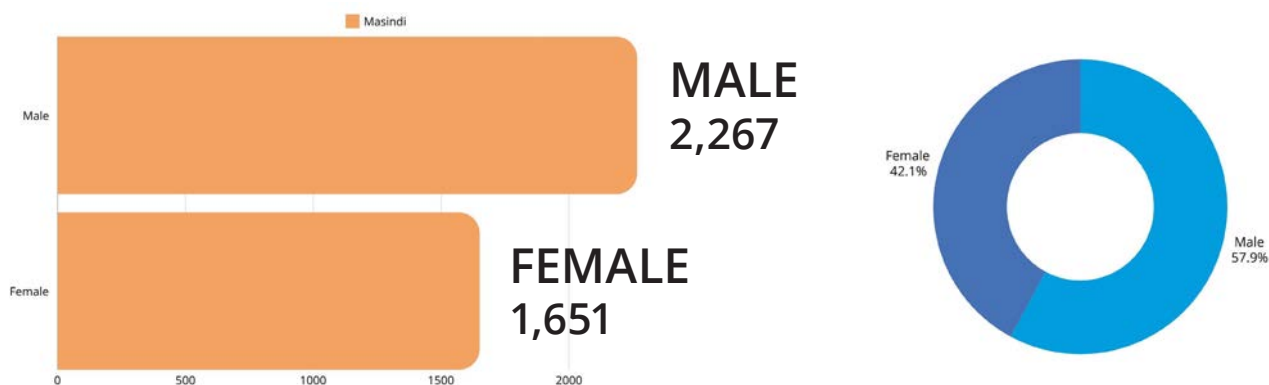

Tournaments achieved: Easter tournament, schools' league, MCCF U15 TOURNAMENT and Post-Independence tournament. Kudos to our sponsors.



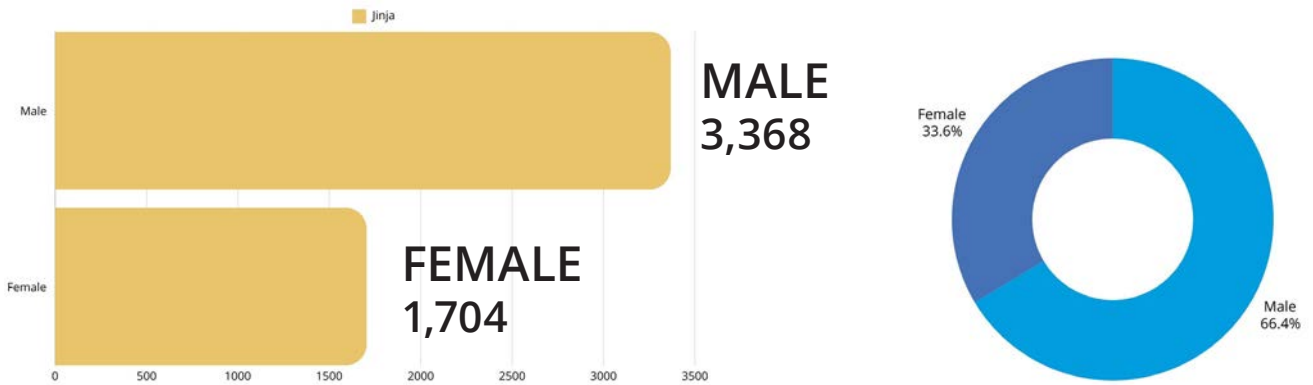
